How to unleash 60% of your church with Jo Gibbs

The all-together-seminar is a focused time on an important topic for us to be leading as leaders in.

This year we have the privilege of Jo Gibbs from Reach Australia helping us thinking through how we care for, raising up and grow women in our ministries.

Women make up 60% of the Australian church, but how can they be more effectively mobilised and equipped for ministry? What does genuine partnership look like between men and women in gospel ministry? This seminar will explore key principles and tools for making this a reality in your ministry context.

Electives

A time to take a deeper dive it into key topics related to our leadership that will better equip, train and support us in the areas of our character, convictions and competencies as we serve - our Electives are a tailored time for this. You get to attendee two out of the four across the conference and can pick on the day.

1. Building Healthy Ministry Teams with Jo Gibbs

How do you get your team working towards the same goals, valuing each other's perspectives and gifts as you serve Jesus? This session will explore the key relationships, results and rhythms to make this happen.

2. Power and Authority in the church with Richard Condie

All of us exercise power in the different ways, and this is especially true for church leaders who carry authority in the life of the church. How we do this matters, so that we carefully raise up others to serve. This seminar will explore the sources of power and models for using it effectively. It will also speak about the temptations and pitfalls of misusing power. This is an essential topic for anyone who wants to lead.

3. Motivating and mobilising leaders and volunteers with Mikey Lynch

This is of the great opportunities we have for investing in the members of our church and increasing our ability to minister effectively to the church and the world. But it is hard to do well. In this elective we will look at some of the values and habits that create a healthy culture for leaders and volunteers in our churches and ministries.
